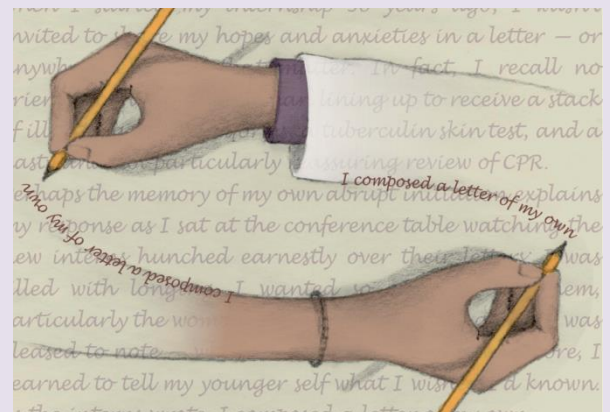

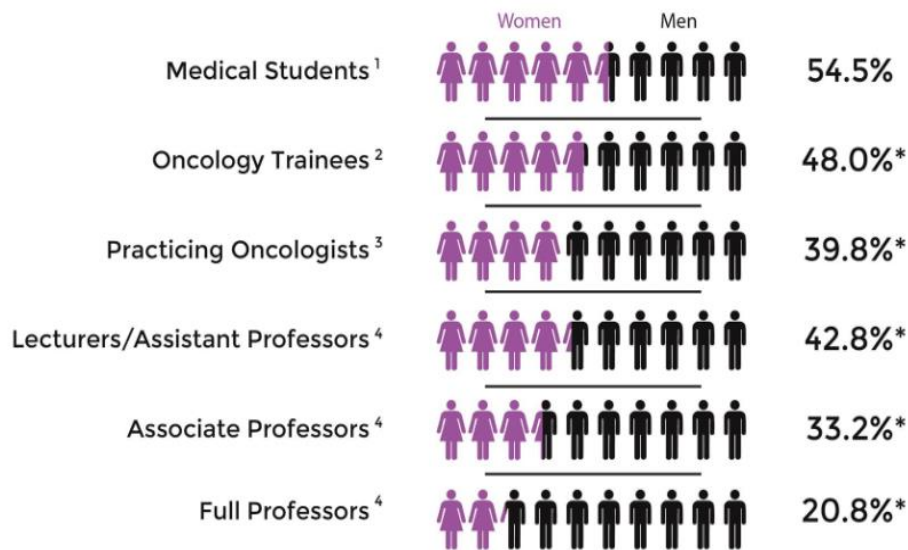
Letter to a Young Female Physician, Suzanne Koven, M.D.

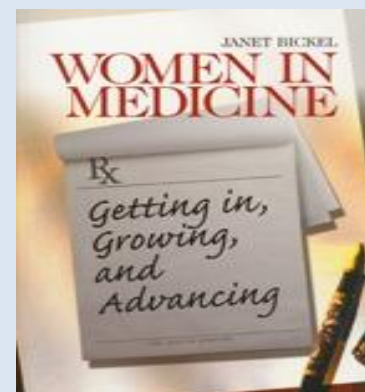
